However, the Invention Convention is an AT-HOME project that will culminate at the schools' Invention Convention on October 18. Through this process, students will understand what it means to be an inventor as they invent something for themselves. A packet of information that will guide any interested students through the Invention Convention was sent home in a parent email and can also be obtained at the school .

If students are interested in making/creating an invention, they need to turn in a signed parent permission form by Wednesday, October 10 (last day of school before Fall Break). This will allow Invention Convention committee members to follow up with students and ensure we plan for enough space in the library on October 18. This is an OPTIONAL activity that students may participate in if they choose to do so. There will not be any grades given/not given with this project, but there will be some awards given for inventions that demonstrate out-of-the-box thinking, creative solutions to everyday problems, etc.

Student inventors who choose to participate in the Invention Convention will have the opportunity to give a presentation on their invention to other students in the school as classes come through the library to see all of the amazing inventions. Parents and other family members can also see the Invention Convention later that night as part of the STEAM Career Family Night that takes place from 6-8 pm.
